ANMED FOUNDATION PROGRAMS & ASSISTANCE FUNDS

Area of Greatest Need

Funds are used where they are needed most to deliver essential healthcare programs and services to meet the needs of our community.

Cancer Care Assistance

Assists patients with the prevention and treatment of cancer, including mammograms and treatments at the AnMed Health Infusion Center.

Cannon Memorial Hospital

This fund helps patients and employees at AnMed Cannon with strategic priorities in Pickens. (Gifts to Cannon Memorial Hospital Foundation should be made directly to them at PO Box 188, Pickens, SC, 29671).

Cardiovascular Care

This fund helps patients access to cardiovascular care and tools to manage heart health.

Chaplain — Spiritual Care

Provides educational support and resources to our chaplains and Spiritual Care Services department.

Employee Financial Assistance

Supports AnMed Health employees facing particularly hard times due to an emergency or crisis and is funded by employee contributions only.

Mammogram

Sustains outreach to women in under-served communities who would not otherwise have access to mammography services.

Medical Education

Provides scholarships to MUSC students at AnMed Health Clinical Campus and supports costs associated with simulation training.

Medical Group Fund

To provide the Medical Group funds that address the needs at the primary care level for patients and staff.

Patient Assistance (Robert B. Claytor)

Purchases prescriptions or medical supplies for low-income patients at discharge who cannot afford to pay for the essential items needed for their healing and recovery.

Pediatric Therapy Works Fund

Provides therapy, assistive equipment and customized programs to help hundreds of children with developmental delays and disorders.

Nursing Excellence Fund (Peggy G. Deane)

Offers financial support for employees to advance their education and training in nursing, nursing education and nursing administration.

Safe Kids

Supports the program that creates awareness and educates parents and caregivers on how to prevent unintentional injuries – the leading cause of death among children and teens from 1 to 19 years old.

Camp Mariposa

Camp Mariposa® Anderson is a free year-round addiction prevention and mentoring program for youth ages 9-17 affected by substance use or substance use disorder in their families. Weekend camps include fun, traditional camp activities that may include swimming, archery, team building, rock climbing, and more. All program activities are offered free of charge to families.

Homeland Park & Varennes School Partnerships

Our children are our community's most valuable assets so United Way and the Rotary Club of Anderson have teamed up to invest in the children of Homeland Park Primary School & Varennes Elementary School to increase their desire for learning and boost the morale of those helping them to learn in these two schools. We will make a positive change in our community when we make positive changes in our children!

Minority Health Coalition

Two years ago, United Way's African American Leadership Society re-established a Minority Health Coalition in Anderson County to partner with AnMed, health care workers, other community organizations and agencies to help bridge the gap in health disparities in our minority population.

United Way Community Gardens

With seed money provided by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture, United Way has teamed up with AnMed to create the Brian White Community Garden at the AnMed North Campus. To create a healthier community this garden will help teach residents to plant, harvest and prepare fresh vegetables.

Weekend SnackPack

Through the Weekend Snackpack program, teachers and counselors at elementary schools in Anderson County, Districts 1-5, identify children who are at the great risk of falling into the Weekend meal gap. The program provides children in need with meals to take home on Fridays. Each enrolled child receives a bag of kid-friendly, ready-to-eat foods on Fridays to take home for the weekend. Children return to school on Monday, well-fed and ready to learn.
